

## DIGEST OF ACTIONS OF THE 2010 CONGRESS

The Oregon Academy of Family Physicians held its 64<sup>th</sup> Annual Congress of the Members in Portland, Oregon, April 8 and 9, 2011; and took the following actions:

- 1. DETERMINED** that a quorum was present to conduct the business of the Congress.

#### **6. Adopted RESOLUTION #1**

RESOLVED, that the OAFP send a resolution to the AAFP Congress of Delegates asking the AAFP to petition CMS to develop an independent RVS Advisory Board with membership representative of the current physician workforce.

RESOLVED, that the AAFP withdraw from any further participation in the RUC, with clear communication that the withdrawal is based on flaws in the current process that cannot be corrected without total restructuring.

#### **7. Adopted RESOLUTION #2**

RESOLVED, that the Oregon Academy of Family Physicians endorses the “One Key Question” campaign, that all doctors should routinely ask women of reproductive age if they intend to become pregnant in the next year, and provide appropriate services as indicated, including screening for pregnancy-related risk factors, provision of prenatal vitamins, complete contraceptive counseling, and counseling on STI prevention, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Oregon Academy of Family Physicians delegates to the American Academy of Family Physicians Congress of Delegates present a resolution asking the AAFP to endorse the One Key Question Campaign.

#### **8. Adopted SUBSTITUTE RESOLUTION #3**

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the OAFP express strong support for the principal concepts included in MedPAC recommendations related to GME funding to our Congressional Delegation, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the OAFP present a Resolution to the OMA House of Delegates supporting the principal concepts included in MedPAC’s recommendations related to GME funding and asking the OMA to submit this

Resolution to the American Medical Association (AMA) House of Delegates for consideration; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the OAFP's Delegates to the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) bring a Resolution to the AAFP Congress of Delegates in 2011 asking the AAFP to commit the human and monetary resources necessary to place a suitable member on the MedPAC Advisory Body to assure the outcome serves the original purpose of enhancing the emphasis and financial support for primary care education.

**9. Adopted RESOLUTION #4**

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the OAFP sign the Open Letter written by Corporate Accountability International to McDonald's asking that they immediately cease marketing promotions to children,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the OAFP ask the AAFP to encourage McDonald's and other national fast food corporations to immediately cease marketing promotions to children.
